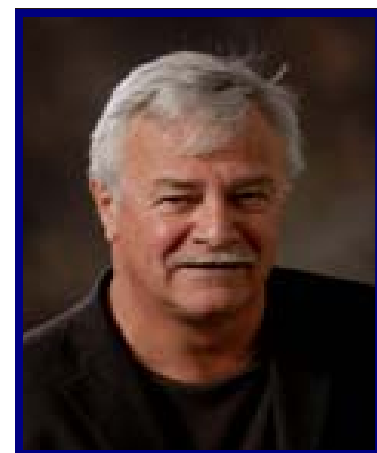

Michael A. Peters is professor of education in Educational Policy Studies at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and adjunct professor in the School of Art at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology. He is also the author of over fifty books, including most recently: *Creativity and the Global Knowledge Economy*, (with Peter Murphy and Simon Marginson) (forthcoming); *Knowledge Economy, Development and the Future of Higher Education* (2007); *Global Knowledge Cultures* (ed.) (with Cushla Kapitzke); and *Building Knowledge Cultures* (with Tina Besley) (2006).

This presentation charts the decline of U.S. science against the rise of other nations, especially China. It provides an analytical description of the **rise of global science** and discusses the development of the **'science economy'** based on new models of openness.

This discussion extends his research in philosophical and political economy questions of knowledge production and consumption and constructions of the **'knowledge economy'**.
