Cascading in Higher Education: Examining the Longitudinal Evidence on Institutional Stratification

Public higher education systems are designed to be highly stratified, from flagship research universities to community colleges. Although widely accepted and institutionalized among policymakers, higher education leaders, and the public, the impact of system differentiation on student admissions patterns and state baccalaureate attainment is not well understood, yet both are crucial components in student access, equity, and the development of state human capital. Professor Bastedo will present published results from qualitative studies of policymakers and the initial results of a national longitudinal study of institutional stratification.
