Thomas Bailey holds a PhD in labor economics from MIT. He is an economist, with specialties in education, labor economics, and econometrics. Dr. Bailey's recent work analyzes access and student success at community college, with a particular focus on the experiences low income and minority students. His articles have appeared in a wide variety of education, policy-oriented and academic journals, and he authored or co-authored several books on the employment and training of immigrants and the extent and effects of on-the-job training. His most recent book, co-edited with Vanessa Morest, is [*Defending the Community College Equity Agenda*](#) (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2006). In this talk, Dr. Bailey will focus on what happens to developmental students who seek enrollment in the community college and what research says about the effectiveness of developmental education.
