Color-blind Racial Ideology: The Politics of Ignoring Race(ism) in Education

After placing color-blind racial ideology (CBRI) within a broader dominant racial ideological framework, the core tenets of CBRI will be outlined in this presentation. A review of the empirical literature will be provided linking greater endorsement of CBRI to a host of psychosocial correlates including racial prejudice, lower multicultural competence, and less adoption of democratic values. The presentation will end with a discussion of the implications of CBRI for educational policies and practices.
