Installing and Using QuickTime

There is one more audio program that you'll need to install on your computer for the HRE Online program if you don't already have it. QuickTime is a program that is used for viewing many course videos.

To install QuickTime:

1. Go to the HRE Online website at www.ed.uiuc.edu/hre/online.
2. Once at the HRE Online website, select **Student Software**.
