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ABOUT THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION DATA BOOK

The College of Education Data Book makes its debut with this report. Prior to this publication, no annual report existed for College of Education student data. As this is a new publication for the College, future publications will undoubtedly build upon this.

This publication has been closely modeled after the University of Illinois Data Book, published by Planning and Budgeting, which can be found online at www.pb.uillinois.edu/dr/databook.asp. The University of Illinois Data Book commonly reports data over a seven year period. The College of Education Data Book is reporting data starting the 2004-2005 Academic Year, when Banner student data became the norm.

Data addressing College of Education Strategic Plan goals are also included.

Enrollment, New Student Characteristics and Academic Performance data is based on the 10th day counts. This information is collected by querying the Banner EDW tables. Degree Conferral counts are not constrained by the 10th day counts as degrees or conferred after the 10th day. The 10th day counts are the official counts used by the University.

Frequently included is Secondary Education Minor. These students are enrolled in the Liberal Arts & Studies College and are receiving a Minor in Secondary School Teaching. Those education courses are taken in the College of Education. Secondary Education students are typically admitted into the minor as Juniors.

Due to University wide software and data conversion in 2004, some data is not available or is represented differently than data for following years.

The College of Education Data Book is an annual publication, released each August. Data included will pertain to previous academic years.

THE IMPACT OF THE UNIVERSITY STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM TRANSITION ON STUDENT DATA REPORTING

Beginning in academic year 2004 – 2005, the University began implementation of the Banner system for collecting and reporting student information at Urbana-Champaign. Student Information Systems (SIS) was developed at the College of Education to work in tandem with the new Banner System for College needs. SIS enables the College to collect data and report on student information that was not being tracked by Banner.

The data represented in this report reflect student data since the Banner system implementation.

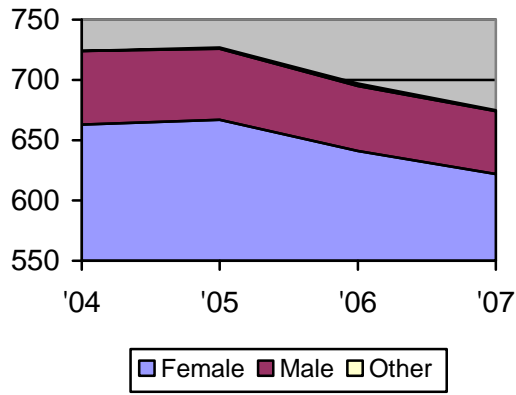

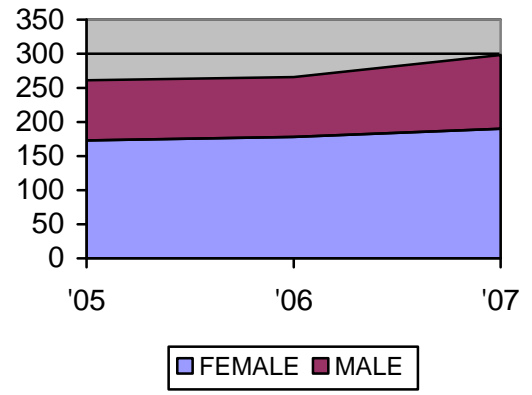

Enrollment Distribution by Gender: Fall 2004 – Fall 2007

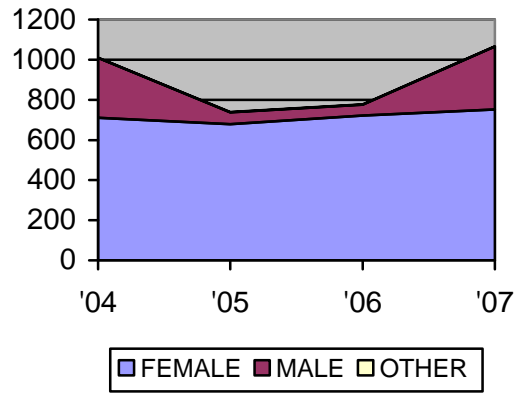

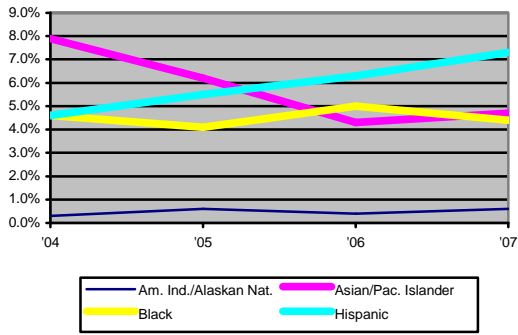

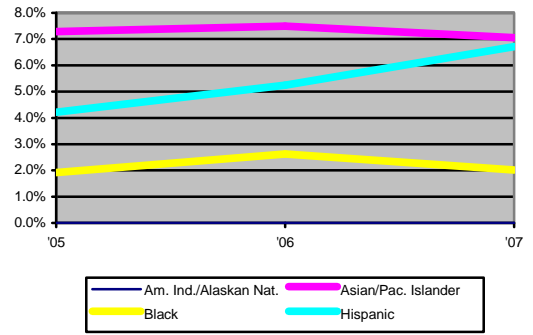

Minority Enrollment As Percentage of Total Enrollment: Fall 2004 – Fall 2007

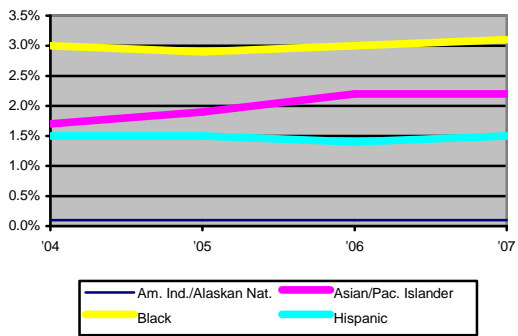

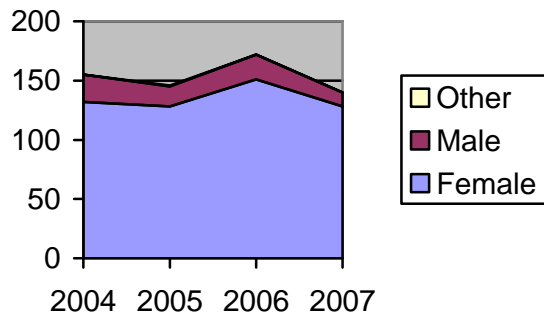

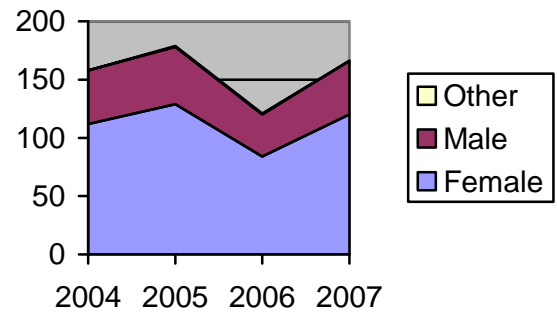

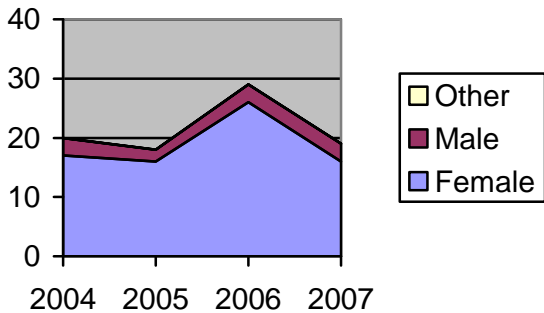

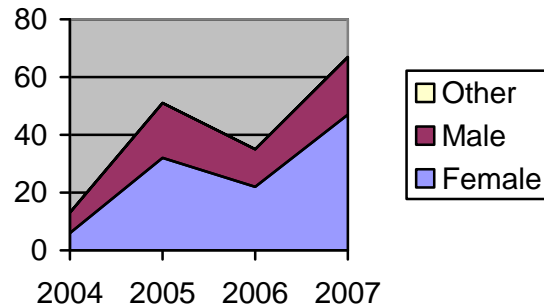

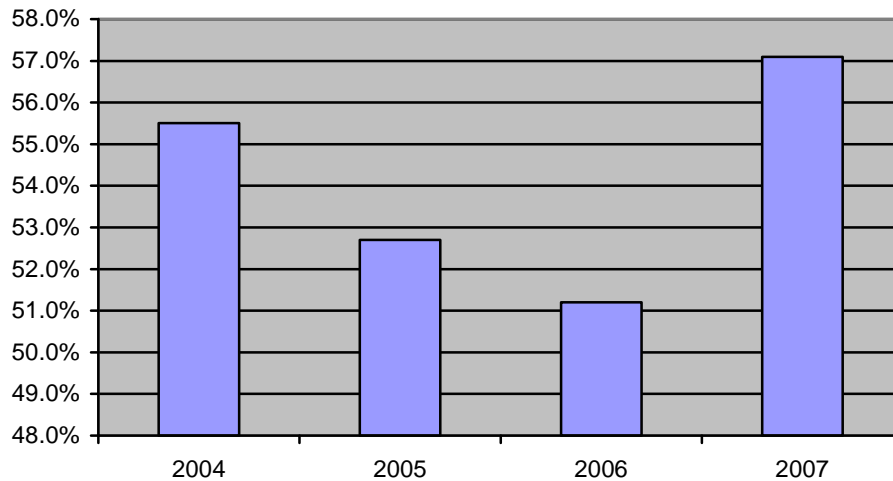

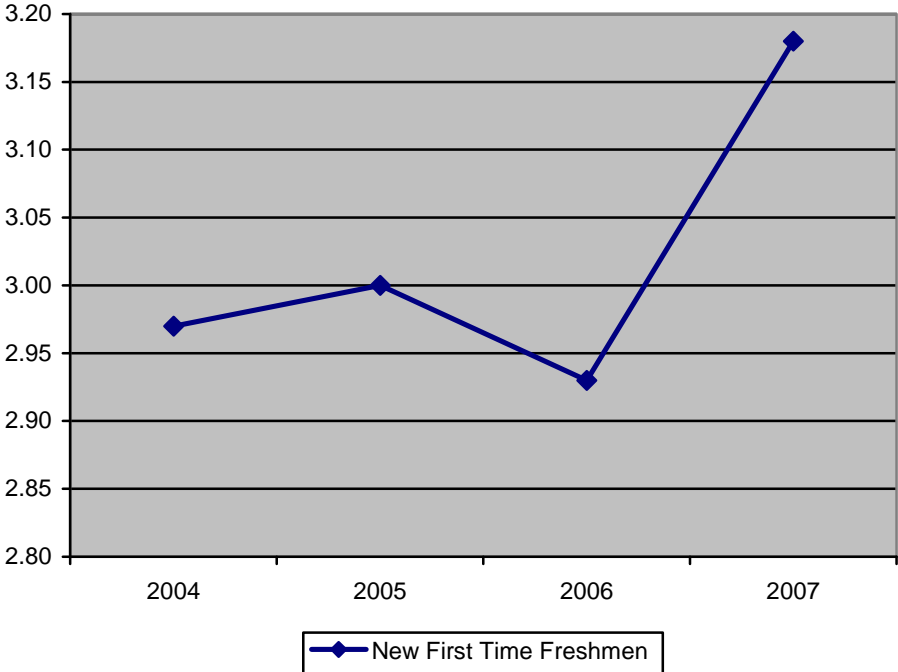
New First Time Freshmen with ACT:C Score of 27 or Higher: Fall 2004 – Fall 2007

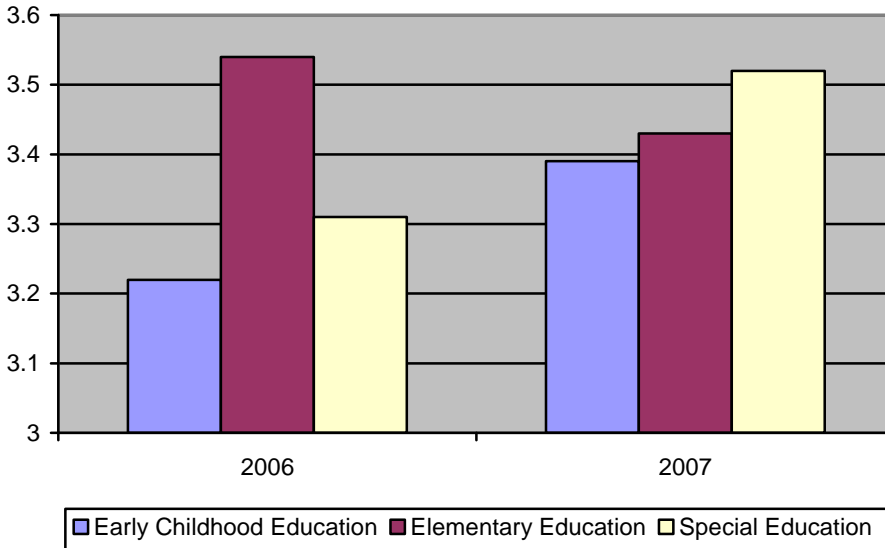

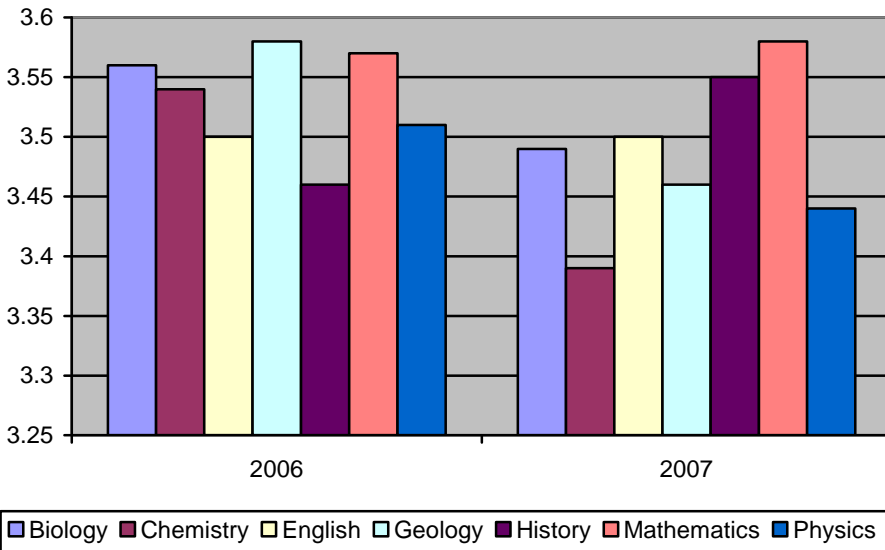

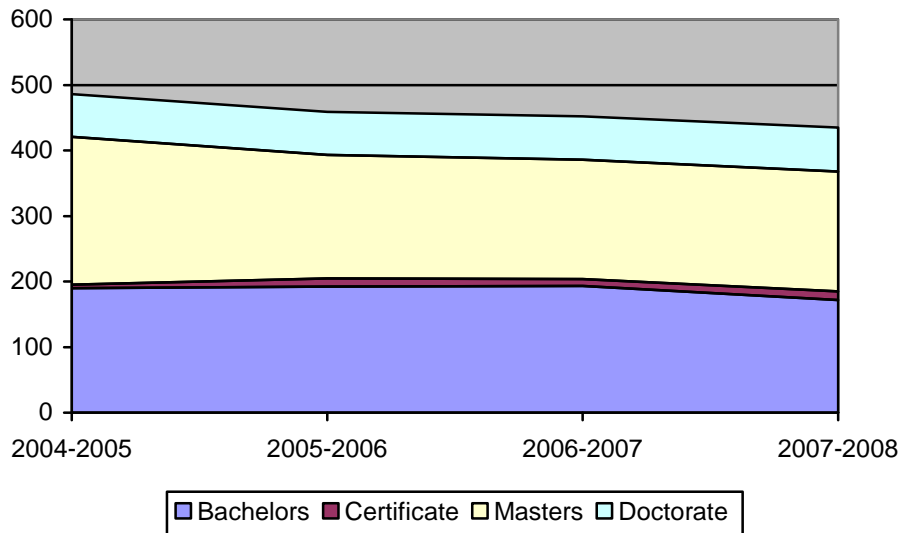

Change in Degrees Conferred by Level: Academic Years 2004 and 2006



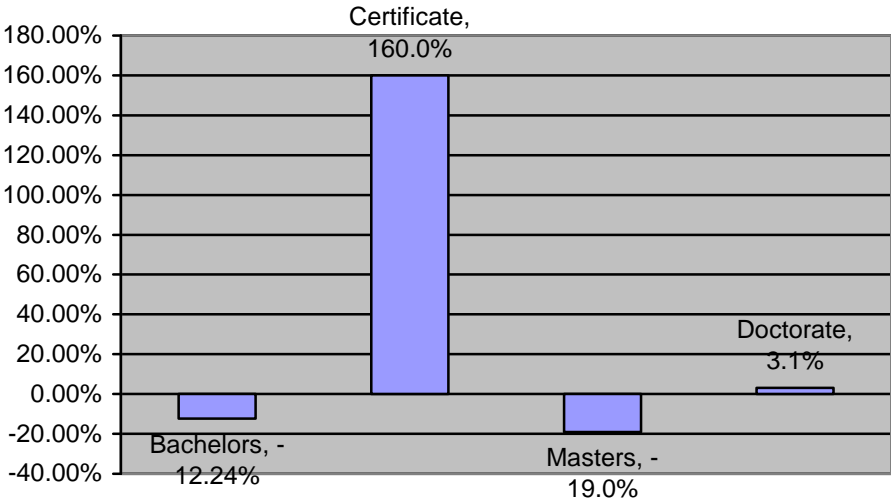
