## ABOUT THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION DATA BOOK

The College of Education Data Book, which made its debut summer 2008, is updated and published each summer. Data included will pertain to previous completed academic years. Student Academic Affairs Office is proud to have the second edition published which includes Academic Year 2008-2009 data as well as new information such as:

- Enrolled student data by department and the College
- GPA over time, as performance indicator

Enrollment, New Student Characteristics and Academic Performance data is based on the 10<sup>th</sup> day counts. This information is collected by querying the Banner EDW tables. Degree Conferral counts are not constrained by the 10<sup>th</sup> day counts as degrees or conferred after the 10<sup>th</sup> day. The 10<sup>th</sup> day counts are the official counts used by the University. Frequently included is the Secondary Education through the College of Liberal Arts and Science and are receiving a Minor in Secondary School Teaching through the College of Education. Secondary Education students are typically admitted into the minor as juniors.

Some data represented is reprinted from the Division of Management Information (DMI), sponsored by the Provost. The DMI data represented here addresses the College Metrics.

Enrollment data is based on the Census counts which coincides with the Fall Term 10<sup>th</sup> day statistics.

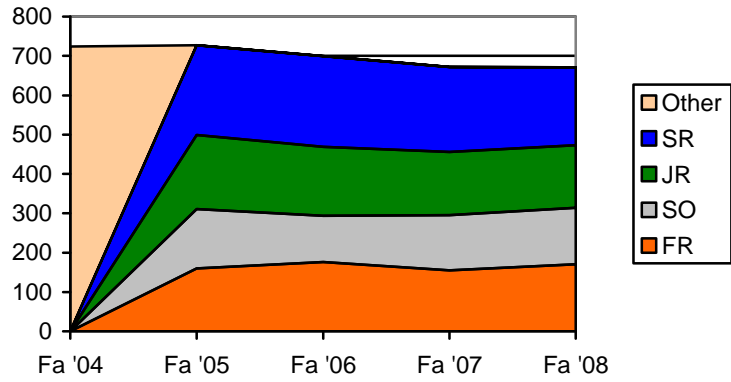

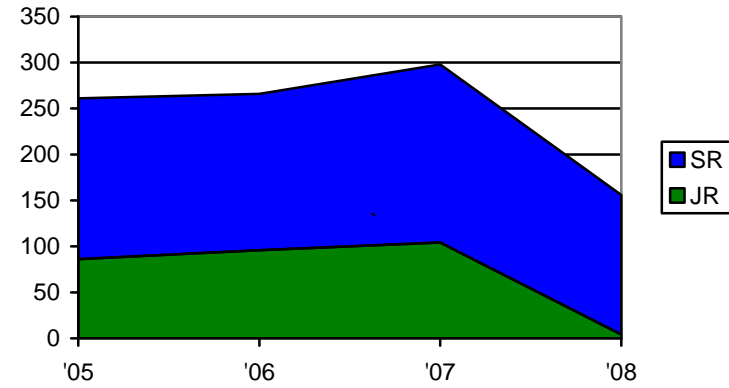

## ENROLLMENT BY LEVEL GRAPH, FALL TERMS

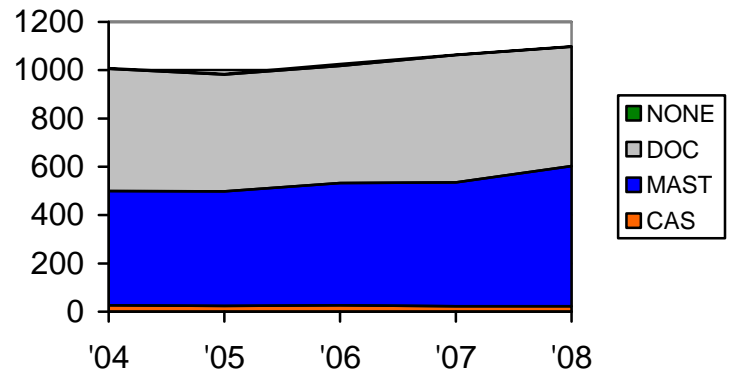

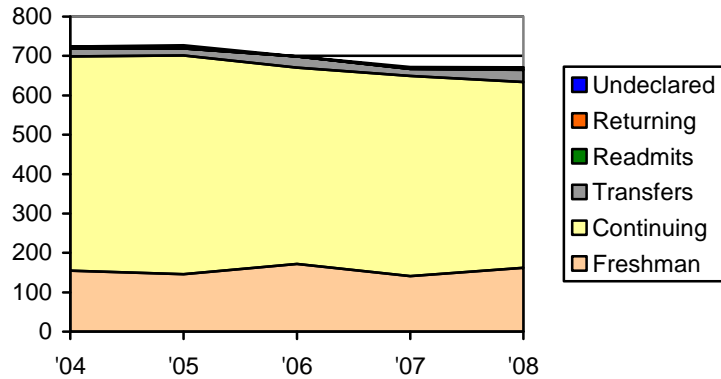

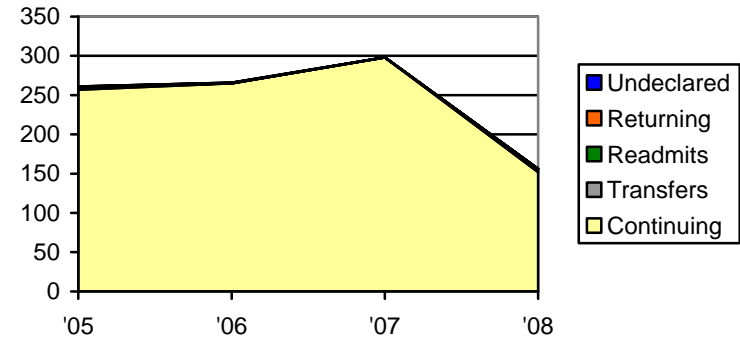

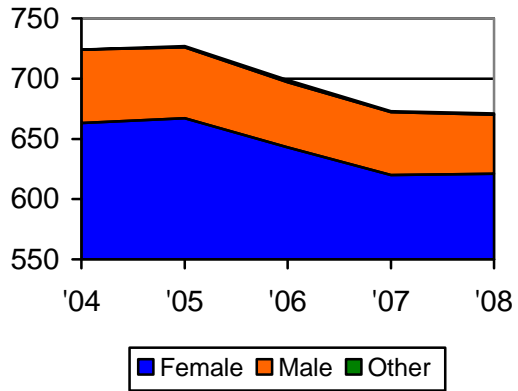

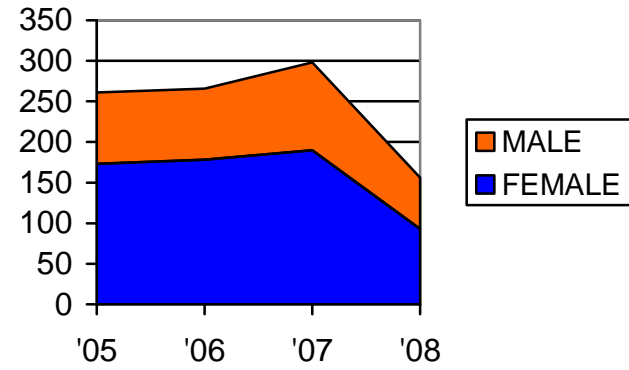

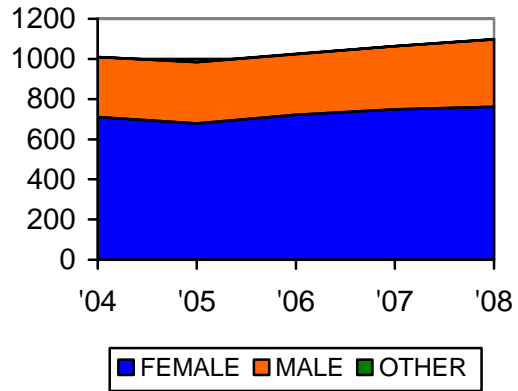
**ENROLLMENT DISTRIBUTION BY GENDER, FALL TERMS**

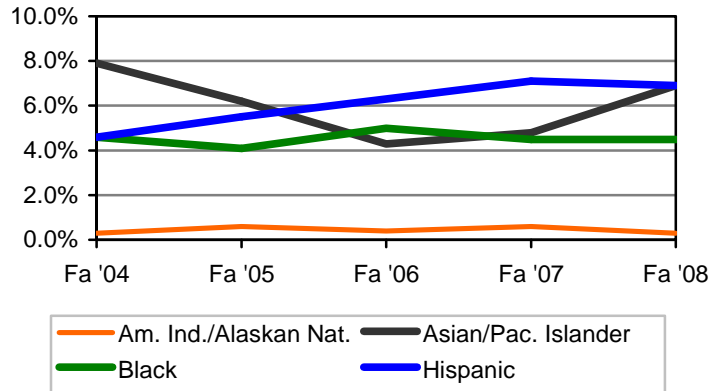

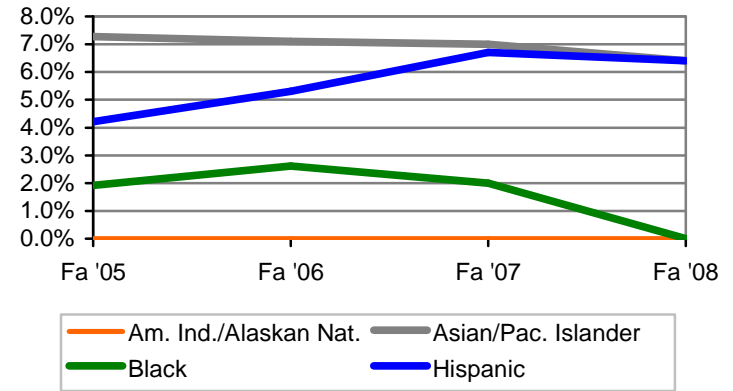

**MINORITY ENROLLMENT AS PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL ENROLLMENT, FALL TERMS**

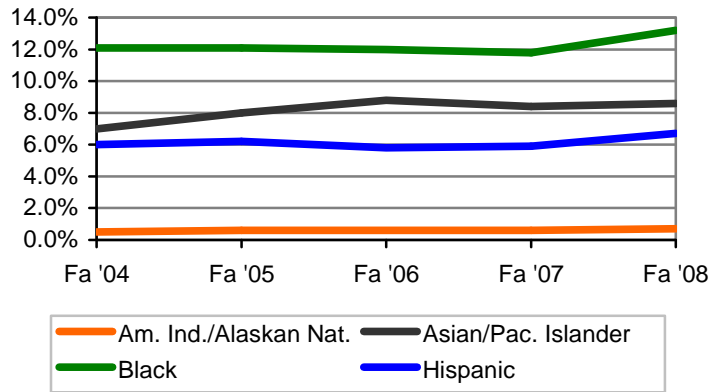

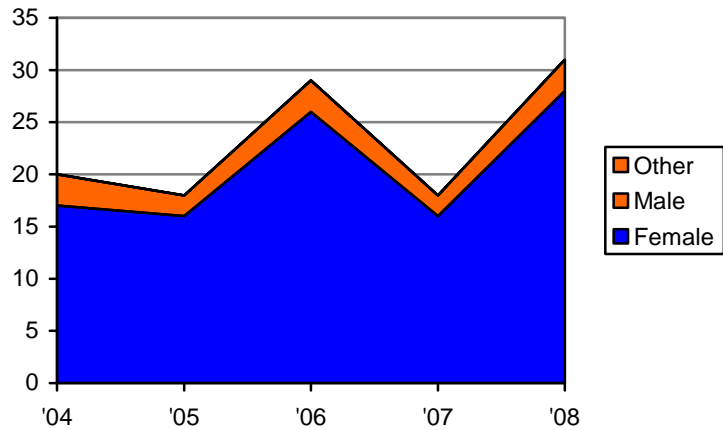

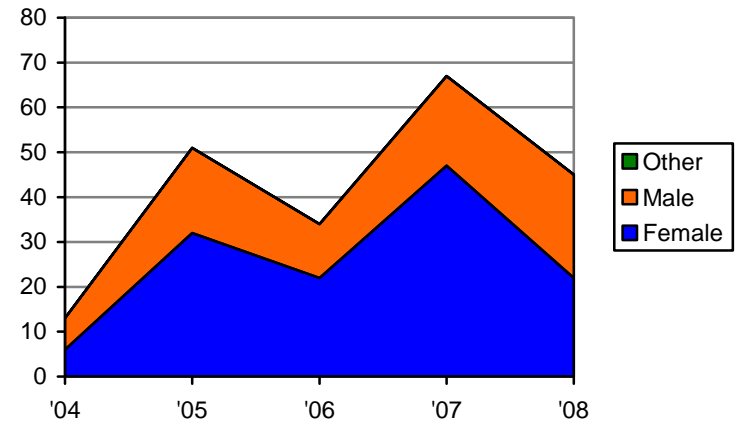

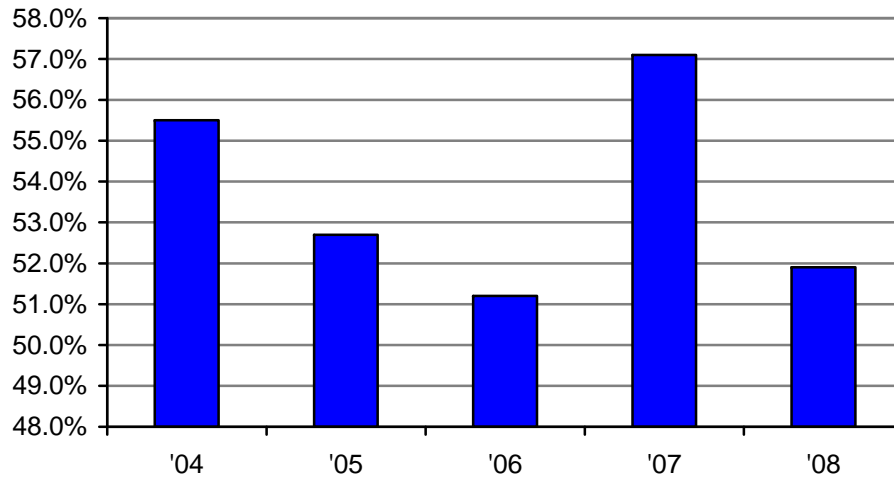

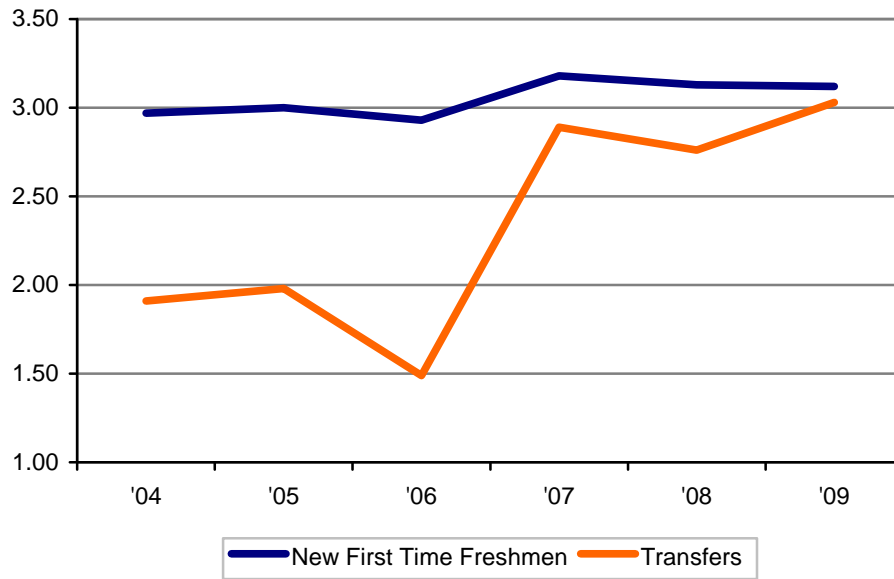

FALL TERMS**



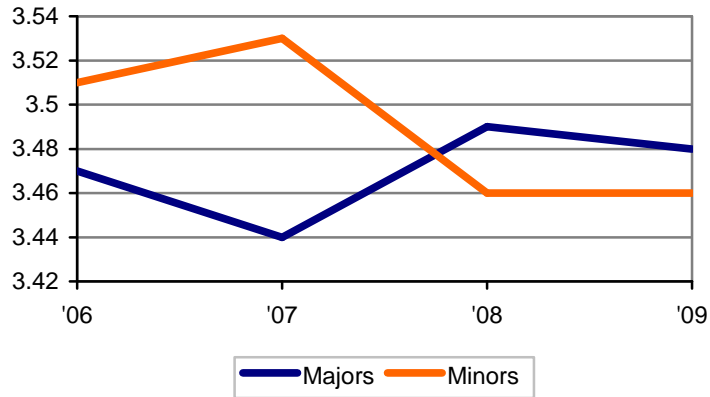

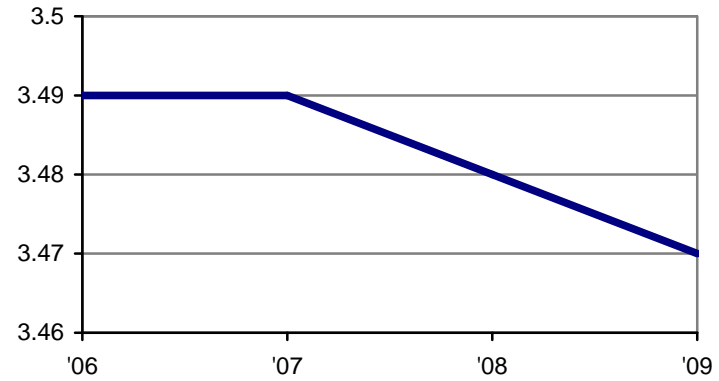

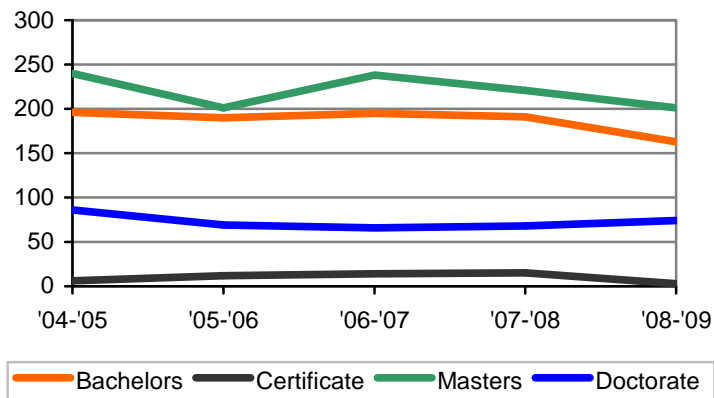

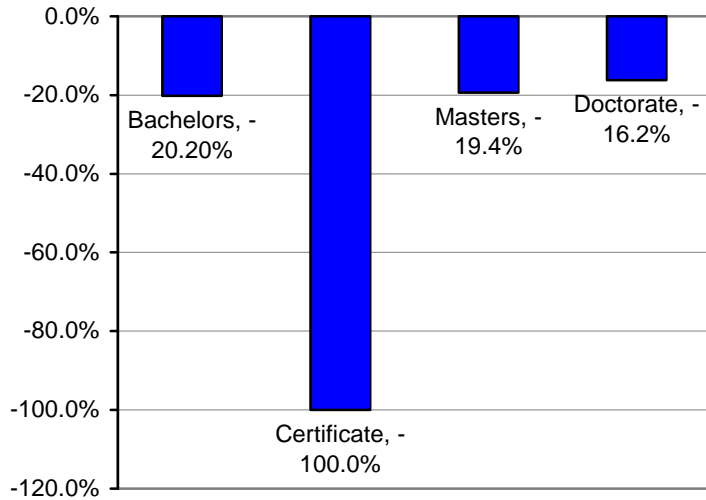
